	Rural Jail-Based Community Health Worker Substance Abuse Intervention	
2C	Description: Intermountain Health partnered with the Sanpete County Jail through the Rural Community Opioid Response Program to pilot a novel approach to aiding inmates with Opioid Use Disorder (SUD). They placed a certified Community Health Worker in the jail to offer intervention and support to incarcerated individuals with OUD. Over the next 16 months, the jail experienced a 60% decrease in recidivism rates as a result.
